Call to Order: 7:30 p.m.

1. No new business.
2. Wild Paster Clear Cut Update - stump removal is planned. Land owner indicated that soil erosion control measures would be in place. The plan is to have stumps ground on site for soil erosion, this is not suitable soil control measure. Need to have ongoing discussion / education of proper soil erosion control measures. Pam to revisit site with inspector to propose soil control measures. Bob brought up that timber cutting application should include reference to steep slopes. The Commission discussed meeting with Selectboard to discuss requirements for timber harvest application. Syd brought up that there is a book outlining Best Management Practices for timber harvest.
3. Highland Road Intent to cut 5 acres of a 12- acre parcel has been approved on 7/11/22 by the Selectboard.
4. Race Update- Courtney indicated there are 52 racers. The course to be marked Friday morning with chalk and signs. Volunteers will be on site to direct racers. There are door prizes and T-shirts to sell. The race will also be an education opportunity. Pam will have maps available showing conservation land.
